CONSUMER INFORMATION REGARDING TREE, SHRUB AND LAWN CARE PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS

The use of pesticides is regulated by the Maryland Department of Agriculture. All commercial pesticide businesses and public agencies that apply pesticides must satisfy certain requirements of the Regulations pertaining to the Pesticide Applicators Law. Some of those requirements are discussed below.

This consumer information sheet answers commonly asked questions about applications of pesticides for tree, shrub and lawn pest control.

1. WHAT ARE PESTICIDES?

A pesticide is any substance used to control pests. The pests may include insects (controlled by insecticides), weeds (controlled by herbicides), and fungi (controlled by fungicides).

2. IS A LICENSE REQUIRED TO APPLY PESTICIDES?

Yes. Each firm that applies any pesticide for hire is required to obtain a pesticide business license from the Maryland Department of Agriculture. A license is obtained by completing an application, paying a fee. Submitting proof of liability insurance and employing at least one certified pesticide applicator who has demonstrated competence in the use of pesticides.

3. CAN I BE NOTIFIED BY THE FIRM PRIOR TO A PESTICIDE APPLICATION TO MY PROPERTY?

Yes. Upon the customer's request, the pest control firm is required to give the customer advance notice of a pesticide application. In addition, individuals who have registered with the Maryland Department of Agriculture as a pesticide sensitive individual, or a person who submits a physician's certificate indicating that he or she should not be exposed to a pesticide because of a current diagnosed condition or ailment, may receive advance notice of tree and lawn pesticide applications to neighboring properties.

4. MUST A SIGN BE POSTED ON MY PROPERTY?

Yes. After a pesticide has been applied to a lawn or to exterior landscape plants, the pest control firm must post a standardized sign at one or more specific locations on the property. The customer is requested to keep the sign in place for 48 hours after the application. Signs are not required for fertilizer

applications.

5. WHAT INFORMATION ABOUT THE PESTICIDES APPLIED SHOULD I RECEIVE FROM THE PEST CONTROL FIRM?

When a pesticide is applied, or at the time a customer enters into a contract with a licensed firm for pest control, the customer must receive the following written information: 1) Name of licensee; 2) Maryland pesticide business license number; 3) Licensee telephone number; 4) Maryland Poison Center telephone number; 5) Common name or active ingredient of pesticide product applied; and 6) One of the following - a copy of the pesticide label; a copy of a portion of the pesticide label containing precautionary statements and environmental hazards; or a document compiled by the licensee that contains appropriate health, safety, and environmental hazard information taken from the pesticide label and approved by this Department.

6. ARE PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS SAFE?

Pesticides, to be effective, are toxic to plants or animals and vary in range of toxicity to humans. The degree of hazard to humans or pets can be reduced if pesticides are applied according to label directions and if the appropriate precautions are followed by the applicator and the customer.

7. HOW CAN I MINIMIZE EXPOSURE TO PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS?

Remove all toys, pet items and lawn furniture from the area to be treated. Close windows. Keep adults, children and pets away from treated areas. Do not stand downwind during or immediately after application of the pesticide. The customer should read the information discussed in question 5. and follow the precautionary statements or health and safety information provided about the pesticide applied to the property.

8. WHAT IF I HAVE A QUESTION OR A PROBLEM?

The Maryland Department of Agriculture, Pesticide Regulation Section, regulates the use of pesticides in Maryland. Pesticides must be applied according to label directions by licensed pesticide firms and under the supervision of certified pesticide applicators. If you suspect that your applicator is unlicensed, or that a pesticide misuse has occurred, contact the Pesticide Regulation Section to request an investigation. Herbicides

COMMON NAME: Sulfentrazone, 2,4-D, mecoprop, dicamba (Surge)

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If in eyes, hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for advice. If on skin or clothing: Take off all contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for advice. If swallowed: Call a poison control center or doctor for advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Note to physician: Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT

Hazards to humans and domestic animals. Danger. Corrosive. Causes irreversible eye damage. Do not get in eyes or on clothing. Harmful if absorbed through skin or if swallowed. Avoid contact with clothing, eyes or skin.

POST APPLICATION INFORMATION: Do not allow people or pets on treatment area during application. Do not enter treatment area until spray has dried.

COMMON NAME: prodiamine (Stonewall Plus Fertilizer)

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT:

CAUTION: Causes moderate eye injury (irritation). Harmful if inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Avoid breathing dust. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Prolonged or frequently repeated skin contact while handling the material may cause allergic reactions in some individuals.

POST APPLICATION INFORMATION: Do not use clippings from treated turf for mulching around vegetables or fruit trees. Keep people and pets off treated areas until dust has settled.

Common Name halosulfuron (prosedge)

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT: Caution: Hazards to humans and domestic animals. Causes moderate eye irritation. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contact with eyes or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: Do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present, or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark.

FIRST AID: If in eyes, hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing. Call a poison center or doctor for treatment advice. If swallowed, call Poison Control Center. Remove particles from mouth. Have person thoroughly rinse mouth with water and spit out rinse water. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow.

Common Name: Triclopyr (Turflon Ester)

If in eyes, hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for advice. If on skin or clothing: Take off all contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for advice. If swallowed: Call a poison control center or doctor for advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Note to physician: Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.

COMMON NAME: Prodiamine+Quinchlorac (Stonewall PQ)

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT: If swallowed, call a physician or Poison Control Center. Have affected person sip a glass of water. Do Not induce vomiting unless told to do so by poison control center. • Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15 - 20 minutes. • Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. • Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice. • Take off contaminated clothing. • Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15 - 20 minutes. • Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice. IF INHALED • Move person to fresh air. • If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth if possible. • Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice. DOMESTIC ANIMALS: This product is considered relatively nontoxic to dogs and other domestic animals; however, ingestion of this product or large amounts of freshly sprayed vegetation may result in temporary gastrointestinal irritation. If such symptoms are observed, provide the animal with plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration. Call a veterinarian if symptoms persist for more than 24 hours.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS: Caution: Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes

POST APPLICATION INFORMATION: Keep people and pets off treated areas until spray solution has dried.

COMMON NAME: glyphosate (Prosecutor)

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT: If swallowed, call a physician or Poison Control Center. If in eyes, flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation persists. DOMESTIC ANIMALS: This product is considered relatively nontoxic to dogs and other domestic animals; however, ingestion of this product or large amounts of freshly sprayed vegetation may result in temporary gastrointestinal irritation. If such symptoms are observed, provide the animal with plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration. Call a veterinarian if symptoms persist for more than 24 hours.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT: Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes or clothing.

POST APPLICATION INFORMATION: Keep people and pets off treated areas until spray solution has dried.

Common Name fenoxypop (Acclaim Extra)

CAUTION Causes moderate eye irritation, harmful if swallowed, avoid contact with eyes, skin, clothing

POST APPLICATION INFORMATION: Do not enter treated areas without protective clothing until sprays have dried

Precautions: Keep out of the reach of Children. Keep people off treated area until foliage is dry. Do not get in eyes. Causes eye irritation. Avoid getting on skin or clothing. Avoid breathing mist or vapors. Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Do not contaminate food or feed. Do Not graze livestock on treated areas. Do not feed treated clippings to livestock or poultry.

Common Name: Sulfentrazone + Quinchlorac. (Solitare)

First Aid: ; If swallowed, call a physician or Poison Control Center. Have affected person sip a glass of water. Do Not induce vomiting unless told to do so by poison control center. • Take off contaminated clothing. • Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15 - 20 minutes. • Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice. IF INHALED • Move person to fresh air. • If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth if possible. • Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice. DOMESTIC ANIMALS: This

product is considered relatively nontoxic to dogs and other domestic animals; however, ingestion of this product or large amounts of freshly sprayed vegetation may result in temporary gastrointestinal irritation. If such symptoms are observed, provide the animal with plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration. Call a veterinarian if symptoms persist for more than 24 hours.

Precautionary Statements: CAUTION Causes moderate eye irritation, harmful if swallowed, avoid contact with eyes, skin, clothing Keep out of the reach of Children. Keep people off treated area until foliage is dry. Do not get in eyes. Causes eye irritation. Avoid getting on skin or clothing. Avoid breathing mist or vapors. Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Do not contaminate food or feed. Do Not graze livestock on treated areas. Do not feed treated clippings to livestock or poultry.

POST APPLICATION INFORMATION: Do not enter treated areas without protective clothing until sprays have dried

Fungicides

Common Name: Propiconazole (Procon Z)

Practical Treatment: If swallowed, immediately drink 1-2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of the throat. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Call physician or contact Poison Control Center. If inhaled, move subject to fresh air. If in eyes, hold eyelids open and flush with a steady, gentle stream of water. Get medical attention or contact poison control center. If on skin, wash with plenty of soap and water.

Precautions: Keep out of the reach of Children. Keep people off treated area until foliage is dry. Do not get in eyes. Causes eye irritation. Avoid getting on skin or clothing. Avoid breathing mist or vapors. Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Do not contaminate food or feed. Do Not graze livestock on treated areas. Do not feed treated clippings to livestock or poultry.

Common Name: Triadimefon + trifloxistrobin (Armada)

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT Causes moderate eye irritation. Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Prolonged or frequently repeated skin contact may cause allergic reactions in some individuals. Avoid breathing dust or spray mist. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse.

FIRST AID: If swallowed, contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Do not give any liquid to the person. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by physician or poison control center. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If in eyes, rinse gently for 15-20 minutes. Get medical attention. If on skin, rinse immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated. Get medical attention immediately.

Common Name: Chlorothalanil (Ensign)

Practical Treatment: If swallowed, Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by physician or poison control center. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Call physician or contact Poison Control Center. If inhaled, move subject to fresh air. If in eyes, hold eyelids open and flush with a steady, gentle stream of water. Get medical attention or contact poison control center. If on skin, wash with plenty of soap and water.

Precautions: Keep out of the reach of Children. Keep people off treated area until foliage is dry. Do not get in eyes. Causes eye irritation. Avoid getting on skin or clothing. Avoid breathing mist or vapors. Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Do not contaminate food or feed. Do Not graze livestock on treated areas. Do not feed treated clippings to livestock or poultry.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT: Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing.

Insecticides

Common Name: abamectin (Avid)

Precautionary Statement: May be fatal if swallowed. Harmful if inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Do not breathe spray mist. Do not get in eyes or on clothing. Repeated exposure may cause allergic reactions in some individuals.

Practical Treatment: If swallowed, contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Do not give any liquid to the person. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by physician or poison control center. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If in eyes, rinse gently for 15-20 minutes. Get medical attention. If on skin, rinse immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated. Get medical attention immediately.

Post application information: Keep people and pets off treated areas during the restricted REI of 12 hours.

COMMON NAME: IMIDACLOPRID (Mallett)

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT: Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing.

FIRST AID If swallowed, contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Do not give any liquid to the person. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by physician or poison control center. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If in eyes, rinse gently for 15-20 minutes. Get medical attention. If on skin, rinse immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated. Get medical attention immediately. **Note to physician:** no specific antidote available. Treat patient symptomatically. This product contains a pyrethroid. If large amounts have been ingested, milk, cream and other digestible fats and oils may increase absorption and so should be avoided.

Common Name: Bacillus Thuringiensis, subsp. Kurstaki (DiPel)

Precautionary Statement: Harmful if inhaled or absorbed through the skin. May cause eye irritation. Avoid breathing dust or spray mist. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse.

Practical Treatment: If on skin, rinse immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. If inhaled, move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 and administer artificial respiration. If in eyes, rinse gently for 15-20 minutes. Call doctor or poison control center for advice.

Post application information: Keep people and pets off treated areas during the restricted REI of 4 hours.

Common Name: permethrin (Tengard)

Precautionary Statement: May be fatal if swallowed. Harmful if inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Avoid breathing mist or dust. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse

Practical Treatment: If swallowed, contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Do not induce vomiting as it may cause aspiration pneumonia. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Avoid alcohol. If in eyes, flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention. If on skin, wash with plenty of soap and water. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated. Get medical attention immediately.

Post application information: Keep people and pets off treated areas during the restricted REI of 12 hours.

Note to physician: This product contains aromatic hydrocarbons which can produce severe pneumonitis if aspirated, consideration should be given to gastric lavage with an endotracheal tube in place. Treatment is controlled removal of exposure followed by symptomatic supportive care.

Common Name: Trichlorfon (Dylox)

Precautionary Statement: May be fatal if swallowed. Harmful if inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Avoid breathing mist or dust.

Practical Treatment: If swallowed, contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Dilute by giving 2 glasses of water to drink and induce vomiting by touching the back of the throat or if available, administer syrup of ipecac. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person. If in eyes, flush with water for 15 minutes. Get medical attention. If on skin, wash with plenty of soap and water. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated. Get medical attention immediately.

Post application information: Keep people and pets off treated areas until this material is washed into the soil and grass is dry. (Approx. 30 minutes) WHITE GRUBS: It is recommended that post watering in take place immediately after treatment. Post treatment watering in may take place up to 24 hours after the application. Do not enter treated areas without protective clothing until sprays have dried.

Common Name: Petroleum Oil (Purespray Petroleum oil)

Practical Treatment: : If swallowed, contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Have person sip a glass of water if able. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by doctor or poison control center. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. If in eyes, hold eyelids open and flush with a steady, gentle stream of water for 15 to 20 minutes. Remove contact lenses if present after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. If on skin, rinse skin immediately for 15 to 20 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing. If inhaled, move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth, if possible. Call poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice. Have product container or label with you when calling a poison control center or doctor, or going for treatment.

Precautionary statement: HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS: harmful if swallowed. Avoid breathing spray. Avoid contact with eyes skin. Causes moderate eye irritation.

COMMON NAME: imidacloprid (Mallett)

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT: If swallowed, call a physician or Poison Control Center. If on skin, wash thoroughly with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation occurs. If in eyes, hold eyelids open and flush with plenty of water.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS: Harmful if swallowed, inhaled, or absorbed through skin. Causes eye irritation. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Avoid breathing dust or vapor.

POST APPLICATION INFORMATION: Keep children and pets off treated area until spray is dry. Do not graze treated areas or use clippings from treated area for feed or forage.

Common Name: Acephate (Orthene '97)

Precautionary Statement: Harmful if swallowed. Causes eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Do not allow children or pets to come in contact with treated areas until spray has dried Avoid breathing mist or dust.

Practical Treatment: If swallowed, Dilute by giving 2 glasses of water or milk to drink and induce vomiting by touching the back of the throat . Contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person. If in eyes, flush with water for 15 minutes. Get medical attention. If on skin, wash with plenty of soap and water. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated. Get medical attention immediately.

Post application information: Do not allow children or pets to come in contact with treated areas until spray has dried.

Post application information: Do not allow children or pets to come in contact with treated areas until spray has dried.

Common Name: bifenthrin (BisectL)

Precautionary Statement: Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Avoid breathing spray mist.

Practical Treatment: Contact physician or Poison Control Center immediately for advice. Have person sip glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a physician or poison control center. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person. If in eyes, flush with water for 15 minutes. Get medical attention. If on skin, wash with plenty of soap and water. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated. Get medical attention immediately.

Common Name: Fipronil (Termidor);

Precautionary statement Harmful if swallowed, inhaled, or absorbed through skin

If Swallowed Immediately Contact physician or Poison Control Center for advice. Do not induce vomiting. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person. Do not give any liquid to the person.

If on skin: Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately for 15-20 minutes. Call Poison control center

If Inhaled: Move person to fresh air; If person is not breathing, call 911; administer mouth to mouth if possible; call poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

If in eyes: .If in eyes, flush with water for 15 minutes. Get medical attention.

DO NOT allow or pets in areas until spray has dried and cleanup is completed (after termite application)
